

WASHER TOSS RULES

Objective

SeaTurtle Sports Washers game comes as a double or single board set. Washer Toss challenges two or four players to score in three holes of different sizes, with the highest points awarded to throws that land in the smallest hole. Rounds are played until one player or team reaches 21 points or opponents agree to a lower point total for quicker play. In the event of a tie, rounds continue until the tie is broken. Similar to horseshoes, washers are usually tossed underhand with a small amount of backspin helping them stick on landing. They can also be thrown like a flying disc.

Set Up and Play

Washers can be played indoors or outdoors on flat and soft surfaces like grass or sand. To begin, each player or team picks a washer color and flips a coin to determine which side throws first. Boards are placed 10 feet apart, but the distance can be increased to make the game harder or reduced for younger, less experienced or special needs players.

Double Board Set: In 4-person team play, teammates split up with each standing next to a board across from the other. Players at one board take turns throwing all of their washers to the opposite board where teammates tally the score, then toss the washers back, repeating the process until one team reaches the agreed upon score. Players must toss their washers without stepping across the invisible plane at the front of the board.

Singles or 2-person play is the same as team play, except opponents toss from the same board and then walk to the opposite board to count their score and toss back at the first board.

In team and singles play, the last team to toss in the prior round begins the next round.

Single Board Set: Players or teams step back from the board 10 feet or any agreed upon distance to establish a shooting line. Players alternate tossing their washers at the board, score the round and then return to the starting line to toss again.



Scoring

Points Awarded:

Top hole	3 pts
Middle hole	2 pts
Bottom hole	1 pt

Points are not awarded for washers landing on the board outside the target holes.
